LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

Use of data to target instruction, align programs, and monitor progress.

Continue to research, develop, and utilize learning tools and strategies that increase student engagement and ownership for learning.

Broaden existing culture of healthy relationships between students and staff.

Maintain school-wide counseling and arts programs focused on meeting the cognitive, social-emotional, college and career readiness, and creative needs of students.

ASSESSMENT AND REPORTING

Continue aligning curriculum, instruction, and assessment to federal, state, and local benchmarks.

Assess readiness for Arrowhead High School (AHS) utilizing academic data, course selection, and disciplinary data from the high school.

Assess readiness for AHS, program effectiveness, and climate of the school by utilizing surveys of internal and external stakeholders.

COLLEGE AND CAREER READINESS

Create a learner responsive environment that is more flexible as to how, when, and where students learn.

Utilize latest technologies to expand learning opportunities to meet individual student needs.

Tailor instruction to engage student in monitoring, evaluating, and directing their own learning.

COMMUNITY AND FAMILY ENGAGEMENT

Continue to encourage community groups to utilize Richmond School facilities.

Continue to support and partner with the Parent Teacher Organization and Booster Club.

FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY

Comply with federal and state guidelines and regulations pertaining to fiscal operations.

The Board of Education, District Finance Committee, District Administrator, and staff will contribute to the development of the annual budget.

The District will maintain a minimum of a 15% Fund Balance in the 10 Fund-General Fun except if confronted with a catastrophic financial event.

The District Administrator will communicate financial information to the community via written reports and podcasts.

The Board of Education will approve annual budgets in which revenues are equal to or exceed expenditures.
